## POSTING TEMPORARY "NO PARKING" SIGNS

With an approved DOMI traffic obstruction permit, permit holders will receive a temporary "No Parking" sign, if applicable. The permit holder is responsible to post these signs on the street(s) to notify drivers not to park within the designated work sites(s) or permitted area(s). The following aspects are to be considered before posting these signs:

- No Parking signs must be posted 48 hours in advance of starting work and need to be clearly visible from the roadway.
- No Parking signs are only valid on the dates and times stated on the sign and on the permit associated with the sign
- No Parking signs shall be posted only in the area described on the permit and are to be used exclusively for activities described in the permit work description
- No Parking signs shall be posted no more than 50ft apart from each other
- No Parking signs may be attached to sign posts, metal poles, wooden poles, or cones. They may <u>not</u> be posted on trees, vehicles, buildings, private property, or on the ground.

Once signs are posted, take a picture of each sign and send the picture(s) via email to domitrafficpermits@pittsburghpa.gov. Please add the permit number and street to the subject line.

If a vehicle is parked in an area where a temporary No Parking sign was posted for over 48 hours, the permit holder may contact the local police department to get permission to tow the vehicle.
